Within my own institution, I have worked to assure that agricultural resources are preserved and made discoverable and that voices that have been

typically marginalized within the story of agriculture are promoted. Additionally, I Chair the WSU Libraries' Faculty Committee where I oversee issues related to the Libraries such as updates to the faculty handbook and tenure and promotion policies.
